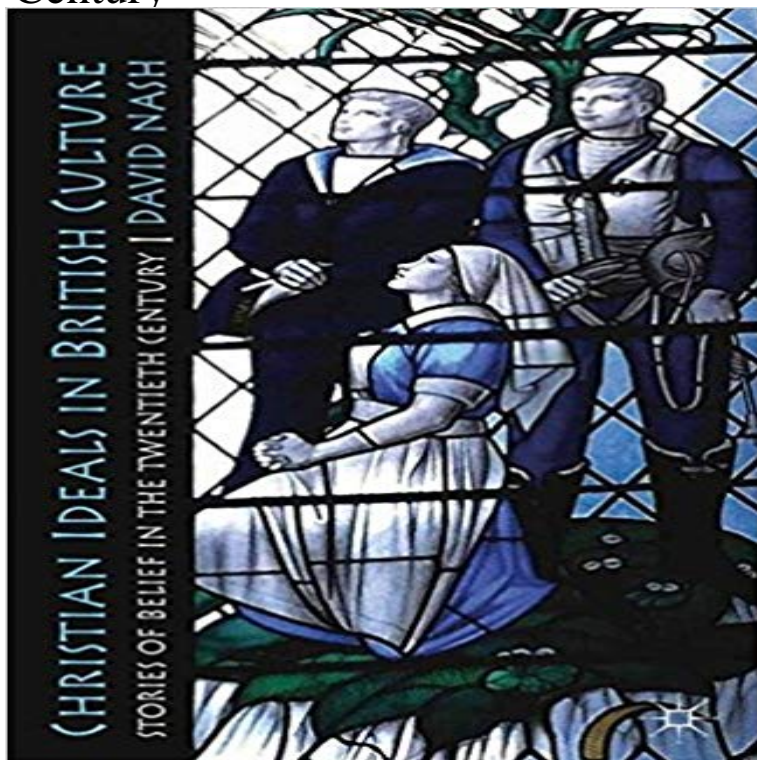


Christian Ideals in British Culture: Stories of Belief in the Twentieth Century
