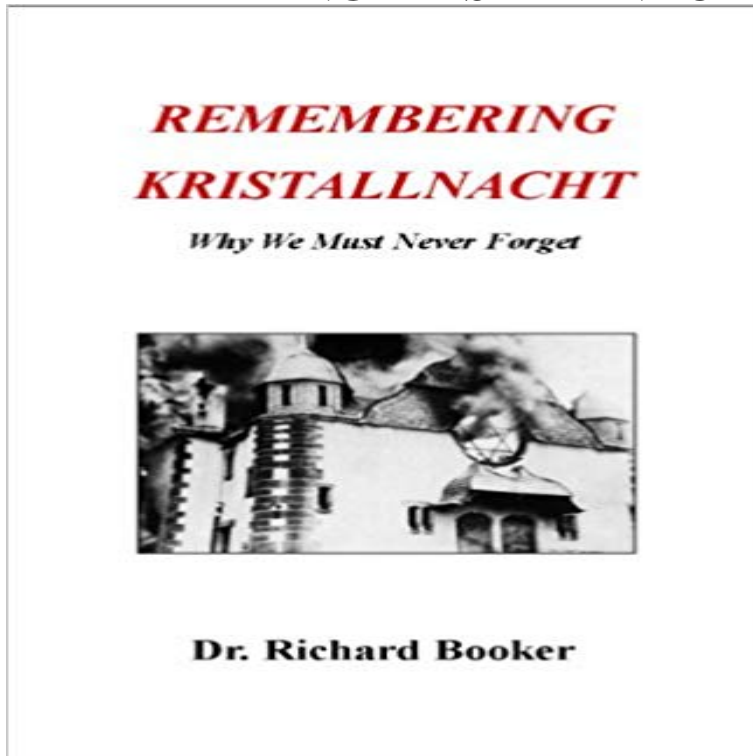


REMEMBERING KRISTALLNACHT
