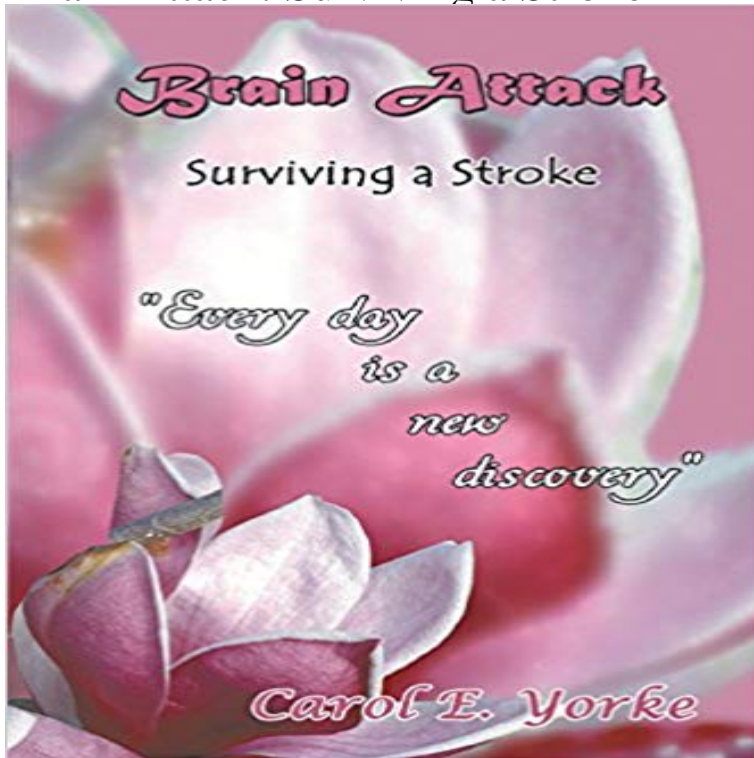


Brain Attack: Surviving a Stroke
