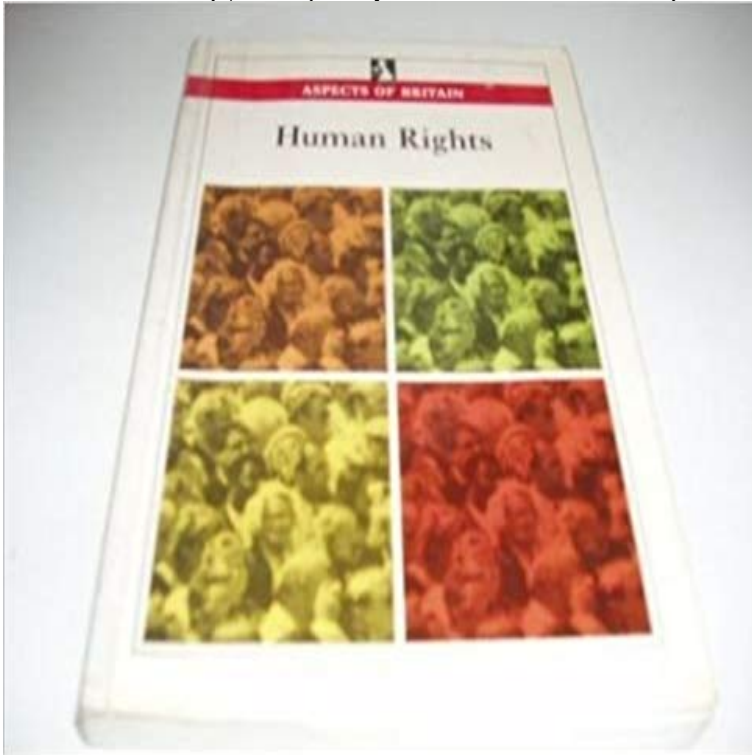


Human Rights (Aspects of Britain)
